FIFTEENTH MEETING

MINUTES

JULY 19 2016

A meeting of the Council of the Township of Enniskillen was held on Tuesday July 19 2016 at 7:00 pm at the Enniskillen Council chambers.

Present: Kevin Marriott, Mary Lynne McCallum, Wally Van Dun, Judy Krall and Kathy O'Hara Wilson.

Mayor Marriott chaired the meeting.

Pecuniary Interest

Mayor Marriott requested that each member of Council declare an interest at the appropriate time within the agenda where an interest may exist.

B. Interviews:

Jake Lozon: Ontario NativeScape- increasing pollinator Habitat along Enniskillen roadsides

The Clerk reported that Mr. Lozon had notified that a personal matter prevented him from attending the meeting. Mr. Lozon planned to attend a future meeting of Council.

Water: LaSalle Line pump station

The Clerk reported that the Brooke-Alvinston Council had approved in principle the sale of water to the Township of Enniskillen to provide water for the area currently pumped in Brooke-Alvinston. A modeling of the pumped area had been completed by R Dobbin Engineering. This work had confirmed that adequate water pressure could be achieved by connecting to the Brooke-Alvinston main. The Clerk noted that an increase in the allocation of water to Brooke-Alvinston would be required to accommodate the expanded pumped area. The Clerk requested permission to attend the next LAWSS meeting to discuss changes to the Brooke-Alvinston water purchasing agreement.

That the Clerk be authorized to attend the next LAWSS meeting to discuss the Brooke-Alvinston water agreement.

The Clerk reported that correspondence had been received from the Village of Oil Springs requesting that the water operating agreement with the Village be terminated on January 1 2017. On the return of the Township water operator a discussion would take place in regards to the termination of the agreement.

Sewer: Oil City Lagoon Discharge

The Clerk reported on discussions held with the Ministry of Environment staff concerning the operations of the Oil City Lagoon. The Clerk reported that the Ministry was indirectly recommending the application of alum to the lagoon. The Clerk reported that correspondence would be provided to the Ministry on the future use of alum at the Oil City Lagoon.

Roads:

The Road Superintendent reported that the contractor MSO was placing slurry seal on Oil Springs Line and would be completed on July 20 2016. He reported that the surface treatment work on Oil Springs Line west of Oil Springs would be undertaken the week of August 15 2016.

Councillor O'Hara Wilson reported that she was concerned in regards to the break-up of the surface of Shiloh Line from Tile yard Road to Mandaumin. The Road Superintendent was requested to review the conditions and report to Council.

The Road Superintendent reported that the Kelly Road culvert on the McFadyen Drain was nearing completion.

Councillor O'Hara Wilson requested that the Road Superintendent confirm with Mr. Thrower that spraying of cat tails would take place at the intersection of Rokeby Line and Plowing Match Road.

Public Meeting- Restricting Access Crooked Road 7:30 pm

- 1. Bluewater Power- Crooked Road
- 2. Hydro One-Crooked Road

Moved by Councillor O'Hara Wilson Seconded by Councillor Krall That the public meeting concerning restricting access to Crooked Road be opened. Carried.

Present: Pat Cooke, Charles Fairbanks and Matt Strangway

The Clerk reviewed the correspondence received from Bluewater Power and Hydro One. Both utilities noted that they wanted to ensure that their infrastructure remained accessible. Bluewater had electrical lines running south of Gum Bed Line. Hydro One had noted that new electrical poles and lines would be required north of Aberfeldy Line for a distance of 150- 200 meters.

Matt Strangway noted that he was present to discuss the use of Crooked Road by persons in Oil Springs who used all-terrain vehicles. He noted that the farmers who cropped the land on Crooked Road had alternative routes to access the farm fields. Since the farmers did not use Crooked Road the road surface condition was not an adequate reason to restrict access to the road.

Charles Fairbank noted that the historical east gum bed was located along Crooked Road. He noted that this area would be developed into a historical site. The actions of the mud trucks was incompatible with this future use. Mr. Fairbank noted that people with the trucks had travelled through his property causing damage to his crops and the road surface on Crooked Road. Mr. Fairbank noted that the four wheelers were entering into his woodlots without permission. Tree stands for hunting had been erected without permission.

Pat Cooke noted that she owned the property in the area but did not frequent

Crooked Road. She noted that her tenant farmer did not access her farmland from Crooked Road. Mrs. Cooke noted that she would support the erection of gates on Crooked Road to control access to the road.

Matt Strangway noted that the erection of the gates may create problems in the area.

Charles Fairbank discussed the original lot development for oil exploration along Crooked Road.

A discussion took place as to the positioning of gates along the road to restrict access.

Moved by Councillor O'Hara Wilson Seconded by Councillor Krall That the Clerk be directed to prepare a bylaw to present to Council to restrict access to Crooked Road. Carried.

Moved by Councillor O'Hara Wilson Seconded by Councillor Krall That the public meeting regarding Crooked Road be adjourned. Carried.

The Clerk reported on the updated Ontario Community Infrastructure Program.

The Clerk reported that a notice had been received that the Police Services Board meeting was to be held on July 20 2016 at 1:00 pm.

A tile loan application was received from Rob Rops for 4647 Fairweather Road.

Moved by Councillor McCallum Seconded by Councillor Krall

That the tile loan application received from Rob Rops for 4647 Fairweather Road be approved subject to the availability of funds.

Carried.

The Clerk reported that the Ontario Government had proposed three application streams to fund activities during the 150 anniversary of the Country.

The Clerk was requested to review the funding available from the Trillium Foundation.

Correspondence was received that discussed the current review of the Ontario Municipal Board.

The Clerk circulated a copy of the risk assessment concerning fire services in the Township. The Clerk noted that it would be discussed at a future meeting.

A notice of the public meeting for the County Official Plan was circulated to Council.

Council discussed establishing future meetings.
