TWENTY-THIRD MEETING

MINUTES

OCTOBER 11 2016

A meeting of the Council of the Corporation of the Township of Enniskillen was held on Tuesday October 11 2016 at 6:30 pm at the Enniskillen Council chambers.

Present: Kevin Marriott, Mary Lynne McCallum, Wally Van Dun, Judy Krall and Kathy O'Hara Wilson.

Mayor Marriott chaired the meeting.

Pecuniary Interest

Mayor Marriott requested that each member of Council declare an interest at the appropriate time within the agenda where an interest may exist.

B. Interviews:

Roads: Bridge Inspection

The Road Superintendent provided a brief review of the bridge inspection report that had been received from R Dobbin Engineering. Mr. Cumming reported that he planned to submit to Council a recommendation for work for the budget process.

The Road Superintendent noted that only one contractor had submitted a proposal for the placement of asphalt on Oil Springs Line to address wheel rutting.

That the proposal from Huron Construction for placement of asphalt on Oil Springs line to address wheel rutting and patching work in Oil City and Rokeby Line be approved.

Christine Poland reported on a meeting held by the County of Lambton on October 3 2016 to discuss the implementation of a bylaw to restrict trucks on Petrolia Line. It was noted that the bylaw would be enforced based on complaints.

The County staff would communicate with trucking firms to warn about the risk of the bylaw being enforced. The representative from the OPP noted that they did not enforce municipal bylaws although they would respond to complaints.

Mayor Marriott noted that County Council would approve the amended bylaw prior to the completion of construction work on Petrolia Line.

Councillor McCallum questioned about line painting on municipal roads. The Road Superintendent reported lines were generally not placed on surface treatment to have traffic stay in the center of the road. He reported that he had requested that the paint crew return to Oil Springs Line east to install a solid line on a hill area.

Water: Brooke-Alvinston water cross connection

The Clerk reported that R Dobbin Engineering had been instructed to prepare drawings for the cross connection to the Brooke-Alvinston main. The information would form part of a presentation to be made to the LAWSS Board and would be used as part of the Township license process should the work be approved. The LAWSS Board had requested representation from the Brooke-Alvinston Council to be present to discuss amendments to their agreement.

The Clerk reported that a review had been undertaken of projects to submit for funding to the CWWF program. A recommendation was made to place funds received towards replacement of equipment at the reservoir. Discussions had been held with Oil Springs but at the present time they had not confirmed interest in the project.

Sewer

The Clerk reported that alum was to be applied to the Oil City Lagoon on October 18 2016. The release of the effluent would follow after sampling of the material. A survey of the lagoon had taken place the last week of September to determine the amount of sludge in the lagoon. Chemical analysis was undertaken of the sludge to determine if land application was possible.
