AUGUST 1 2017

A meeting of the Council of the Corporation of the Township of Enniskillen was held on Tuesday August 1 2017 at 7:00 pm at the Enniskillen Council Chambers.

Mayor Marriott chaired the meeting.

Pecuniary Interest

Mayor Marriott requested that each member of Council declare an interest at the appropriate time within the agenda where an interest may exist.

- C. Roads: Update on Shiloh Line, Wanstead Road drainage, The Road Superintendent discussed construction work on Shiloh Line.

The Road Superintendent noted that he would be receiving additional information on the purchase of a new tandem truck from suppliers.

The Road Superintendent noted that only one of the two bridge contractors had provided an estimate for the work on the Black Creek Bridge on Oil Springs Line. He noted that due to existing contractor work schedules it may be difficult to get the work completed in 2017.

The Road Superintendent was instructed to obtain an engineer's review of the condition of the culvert located on Rokeby Line that had been damaged by a motor vehicle accident in January of 2017.

The Road Superintendent discussed the road side ditch construction along Wanstead Road.

A decision was made not to enter into a service agreement with Toromont for the new grader.

Water: Update on Activities-Sensus residential meters, Update on reservoir project

It was noted that a preconstruction meeting was to be held with the contractor to discuss the work schedule for the SCADA and electrical work at the reservoir. Mike Cumming discussed issues with the control system at the LaSalle pump station. He noted that the representative from DATA soft was to be present on August 2 2017 to review the problem.

The Clerk noted that planning was underway for the placement of Alum in the lagoon at Oil City in the fall.
