MINUTES

JULY 6TH 2020

A meeting of the Council of the Corporation of the Township of Enniskillen was held on Monday July 6 2020 at 7:15 pm following the Committee of Adjustment. The meeting was held electronically using the internet. The public was able to view the meeting by following contact information found on the municipal website made available on July 6th 2020.

Mayor Marriott chaired the meeting.

Pecuniary Interest

Mayor Marriott requested that each member of Council declare an interest at the appropriate time within the agenda where an interest may exist.

A. **Public Meeting** to consider a proposed Zoning By-law Amendment under Section 34 of the Planning Act, R.S.O. 1990, as amended.

The Proposed Zoning By-Law Amendment would amend the Township of Enniskillen Zoning By-law 58 of 2015 as it applies to lands described as Concession 5, West Part Lot 29, known as 5830 Courtright Line. The rezoning is a condition of severing an existing house from a farm property and would recognize a farm size less than 93 acres and prohibit a dwelling on the retained farmland.

Mr. Nesbitt reported that the Committee of Adjustment had approved a severance to permit the removal of a dwelling from the farm located at 5830 Courtright line.

As a condition to the severance a rezoning had been required to recognize a farm size smaller than that permitted in the zoning bylaw. The second condition of the severance was to rezone the remaining farm land to not permit the construction of a house on the property.

There was no one present to comment on the rezoning application.

B. **Public Meeting** to consider a proposed Zoning By-law Amendment under Section 34 of the Planning Act, R.S.O. 1990, as amended.

The Proposed Zoning By-Law Amendment would amend the Township of Enniskillen Zoning By-law 58 of 2015 as it applies to lands described as Concession 1, West Part Lot 23, known as 5272 Aberfeldy Line. The rezoning is a condition of severing an existing house from the property and would prohibit a dwelling on the retained farmland

Mr. Nesbitt noted that the Committee of Adjustment had approved a severance to permit the separation of the house from the farm at 5272 Aberfeldy Line. He noted that conditions were applied to the severance requiring that a rezoning take place to prohibit the construction of a house on the retained farmland and recognize a reduction in the minimum distance separation between the new lot and the cattle operation to the south.

Drainage: Request for Maintenance Fox Creek, McKenzie Drain new culvert, Bradley Drain move culvert, Drainage Report June 30 2020.

The Clerk reported that a request had been received to replace a culvert on Fox Creek north of Shiloh Line. A hole had developed in the culvert.

The Clerk reported that a notice would be sent to the ratepayers on the drain to determine if additional work was required.

The replacement of the culvert was permitted under a current report for Fox Creek.

The Clerk reported that a request had been received to install a new culvert on the McKenzie Drain south of Petrolia Line. The farmer had requested the new culvert to provide a safer access to the farm property. The Clerk reported that a notice would be sent to ratepayers informing them of the proposal. A resolution to authorize a new report would be required to initiate the project.

The Clerk requested that a site meeting be held on the Bradley Drain to review the replacement and the movement of the culvert on the drain.

1. Orval Slack –Open Letter to the Ontario Federation of Agriculture

Councillor Krall reported that hoop greenhouses were being moved unto farms in Norfolk County to permit the unregulated growing of cannabis. Councillor Krall reported that the concerns had been put forward to the Ontario Federation of Agriculture for a response. Councillor Krall noted that she had accepted an invitation to meet with the Minister of Agriculture and had submitted a question regarding cannabis for the meeting.

- Petrolia North Enniskillen Fire Department 2021 Budget Chief Arns was present for the discussion of the fire department budget.

A discussion took place regarding the capital items presented for the 2021 budget.

Chief Arns reported that the current air tank refill system did not meet current standards. He outlined that if the system were not replaced the department would need to attend other locations in Sarnia to refill tanks.

He reported that he was recommending the replacement of all remaining self -contained breathing apparatus to the new models.

Chief Arns noted that the current SCBA were inspected and compliant.

Chief Arns agreed to report back to Council with more detailed information on the proposed capital purchases.
