TWENTY-FOURTH MEETING

MINUTES

**DECEMBER 21 2020** 

A regular meeting of the Council of the Township of Enniskillen was held on Monday December 21 2020 at 7:00 pm with access to the public to electronically join or view the meeting through a Zoom Teleconference format. Information was available on the municipal website to gain access to the meeting.

Mayor Marriott chaired the meeting.

## **Pecuniary Interest**

Mayor Marriott requested that each member of Council declare an interest at the appropriate time within the agenda where an interest may exist.

## A. Minutes

Moved by Councillor Krall Seconded by Councillor Burke That the minutes of the meeting of December 7<sup>th</sup> 2020 be adopted as circulated. Carried.

Ray Dobbin reviewed the changes to the Drainage Act which were intended to provide a simpler process to address drain modifications on one property and to implement post construction changes to drain reports.

There were no appeals submitted for the assessment to the 12<sup>th</sup> Concession Drain.

Mike Annett confirmed that he had spoken with Ray Dobbin and had clarified his question about the drain assessments.

Moved by Councillor Van Dun Seconded by Councillor Burke That the assessments for the 12<sup>th</sup> Concession Drain be confirmed. Carried.

Brooke-Alvinston appointment of Mayor Ferguson to the Court of Revision

That Councillor Krall be appointed as Chair of the Court of Revision for the 13<sup>th</sup> and 14<sup>th</sup> Concession Drain and that Councillor Van Dun be appointed to the Court of Revision.

Carried.

Mayor David Ferguson was present electronically for the Court of Revision.

The Engineer and Clerk reported that there were no appeals made to the Court of Revision for the 13<sup>th</sup> and 14<sup>th</sup> Concession Drain.

Ray Dobbin noted that the two projects were straight forward installation of culverts on the two drains.

Moved by Councillor Van Dun Seconded by Mayor Ferguson

That the assessments in the reports for the 13<sup>th</sup> and 14<sup>th</sup> Concession Drains be confirmed.

Carried.

Moved by Councillor Van Dun Seconded by Mayor Ferguson

That the Court of Revision for the 13th and 14th Concession Drains be closed. Carried.

Drain Request 4th Concession Drain,

A request was received from Lisa Moffat to replace the access culvert on the 4<sup>th</sup> Concession Drain at 5476 Courtright Line. The Drainage Superintendent had reported that the culvert needed to be replaced. He recommended that since a tender had been received for replacement of another culvert on the drain that he be permitted to confirm with the contractor the installation of the culvert without proceeding to an additional tender.

Moved by Councillor McCallum Seconded by Councillor Krall

That the Drainage Superintendent proceed to have the access culvert on the 4<sup>th</sup> Concession Drain replaced.

Carried.

Drain Tenders: 4th Con, 12th Con, 13th Con and 14th Con Drains

Moved by Councillor Van Dun Seconded by Councillor McCallum

That the low tender from Bruce Poland Trucking be accepted for the culvert replacements on the 4<sup>th</sup> Concession Drain, 12<sup>th</sup> Concession Drain, 13<sup>th</sup> Concession Drain and the 14<sup>th</sup> Concession Drain.

Carried.

A drain maintenance request was received from Anson Racher for the replacement of the access culvert at 4340 Black Ash Road on the Richards Drain.

It was noted that work had started on construction of the drain which included the replacement of similar sized culverts. The Drainage Superintendent recommended that the current contractor install the additional access culvert based on the tendered costs for the similar culvert on the Richards Drain.

Moved by Councillor McCallum Seconded by Councillor Krall

That the Drainage Superintendent be authorized to replace the access culvert at 4340 Black Ash Road on the Richards Drain. Carried.

Working Group to Better Focus Conservation Authorities
The Clerk noted that the Minister of Environment announced the creation of a
working group to provide guidance in the introduction of changes to the
operational authority of Conservation Authorities.

#### Water:

Ray Dobbin presented an overview of the modelling undertaken of the LaSalle pumping station in Brooke-Alvinston. Using the Township modelling software he reported that restrictions would need to be implemented in one site to provide

water for hog operations. He also noted that there would be sufficient water to provide for a chicken barn and the remaining residential services in the area. He recommended that the livestock operators be required to maintain 48 hours on site water storage.

A discussion took place regarding the current limitations on water for additional growth in the pumped area. It was noted that additional discussions would take place with Brooke-Alvinston representatives on the matter.

## **DWQMS Annual Audit**

That the 2020 Drinking Water Quality Management Audit report be accepted. Carried.

Sewer: Update on Sewer lagoon discharge

The Clerk reported that the discharge of the Oil City Sewage Lagoon had not taken place as the effluent had not met discharge standards.

Roads: LaSalle Line- Bear Creek Bridge tenders

Tender results for the deck refurbishment on the LaSalle Line Bear Creek Bridge were reviewed.

Ken Graham recommended that the low tenderer would be able to complete the work on the bridge.

That the low tender from Theo Vendenberk Construction be accepted for the deck refurbishment on the LaSalle Line Bear Creek Bridge.

## E. Public Meeting Rezoning 7:45 pm

Moved by Councillor Van Dun Seconded by Councillor Burke

That the public meeting for a proposed zoning application for 3263 Petrolia Line be opened.

Carried.

The proposed zoning amendment to Bylaw 58 of 2015 as it applies to lands described as Concession 10 E ½ Lot 3 known as 3263 Petrolia Line. The rezoning is a condition of severance of an existing house from the property and would prohibit a dwelling on the retained farmland. The amendment would also recognize an oversized accessory building (214 square meters) and a reduced rear yard setback of 1.5 meter on the severed residential lot.

1. Correspondence: Rob Nesbitt County of Lambton

Mr. Nesbitt reviewed his report regarding the proposed rezoning. He noted that the rezoning had been submitted to fulfill a condition of severance application B005/20. The approved severance provided that the house on the farm would be placed on a separate lot. The zoning on the remaining farm land would be changed so as not to permit a dwelling in the future.

The bylaw also recognized an oversized shed on the proposed residential lot with a reduced rear yard setback of 1.5 meters.

Mr. Nesbitt recommended approval of the rezoning.

Donna May Teskey noted that she had no comment on the application.

Moved by Councillor Van Dun Seconded by Councillor Burke That the rezoning application for 3263 Petrolia Line be supported. Carried.

Moved by Councillor Krall Seconded by Councillor Burke

That the public meeting regarding the rezoning of 3263 Petrolia Line be closed. Carried.

Councillor Krall noted that the High Park cannabis facility was part of a corporate merger between Tilray and Aphria.

Councillor Krall questioned if the production of cannabis at the High Park greenhouse was to stop could another company continue to grow cannabis on the site.

The Planner noted that the growing of cannabis could continue at the site.

Mr. Nesbitt noted that some municipalities had implemented bylaws which restricted the growing of cannabis to specific industrial zones.

Mr. Nesbitt noted that Plympton-Wyoming had introduced an interim control bylaw to permit time to study what type of restrictions could be put in place to grow cannabis.

Moved by Councillor Krall Seconded by Councillor McCallum

That the Planner prepare a memo on cannabis growing and report back to Council in January of 2021.

## 5. Memo Off Road Vehicles- Bylaw 68 of 2020

The Clerk reviewed proposed changes to regulations under the Highway Traffic Act as they related to off road vehicles. A bylaw had been circulated that would prohibit off road vehicles on Township roads starting January 1 2021.

The bylaw would recognize that farmers, trappers and public service employees would continue to have the right to use Township roads.
