Councillor McCallum reported that she had received a complaint that the recycling bins were too full to deposit materials on Monday March 15 2021. The Clerk noted that he would speak to the site operator and Waste Management to discuss the matter.

Councillor Van Dun questioned whether a report had been received from the dog control officer. The Clerk noted that he would discuss the matter with the dog control officer.

2. Drainage: Site meeting minutes- Bygrove Drain, Phillips Drain and O'Dell Park Drain

Ray Dobbin reported on the site meeting from the O'Dell Park Drain. He indicated that a new report was required under Section 78 of the Drainage Act as there were no specifications in the current report for culverts.

Moved by Councillor Krall Seconded by Councillor Van Dun

That R Dobbin Engineering be appointed to prepare a report under Section 78 of the Drainage Act to prepare a new report for the O'Dell Park Drain. Carried.

The minutes for the Phillips Drain site meeting were reviewed.

The rate payers had requested that the open drain be wicked and cleaned.

The minutes also noted that the current report for the drain made no provisions for the replacement of culverts.

Moved by Councillor McCallum Seconded by Councillor Krall

That that R Dobbin Engineering be appointed to prepare a new report under Section 78 of the Drainage Act for the Phillips Drain.

Carried.

Moved by Councillor Van Dun Seconded by Councillor Krall

That the Drainage Superintendent be directed to proceed to have the Phillips Drain cleaned and brushed.

Carried.

Moved by Councillor Van Dun Seconded by Councillor Krall That the Drainage Superintendent proceed to have maintenance work undertaken on the Bygrove Drain. Carried.

Update Caroline St Drain

Councillor McCallum had requested that a discussion take place regarding a property owner complaint concerning the replacement of tile on the Caroline Street Drain.

Ray Dobbin provided a general overview of the work which included the removal of a tree, replacing tile plugged with tree roots and the replacement of the outlet culvert to the tile drain.

Mr. Dobbin reported that the cleanup associated with the work had been delayed due to weather.

A discussion took place regarding incorporating new construction standards in residential areas to improve the appearance of the drainage work.

3. St Clair Region Drain Review Process

Ray Dobbin discussed an information session held by the St Clair Region Conservation Authority regarding the drain enclosure policy. He reported that the Conservation Authority viewed a man-made drain to be included within the definition of a water course and therefore subject to the permitting regulations under Section 28 of the Conservation Authorities Act. Mr. Dobbin noted that the Department of Fisheries and Oceans had recently indicated that they were to extend their regulatory control to road side ditches not associated with the Drainage Act.

Moved by Councillor Krall Seconded by Councillor McCallum

That a letter be sent to the Minister of Environment, Climate and Parks to requests that the regulations under the Conservation Authorities Act clearly define watercourses.

Carried.
