The Clerk reported that the Road Superintendent had met with a contractor to work out a cost for the Rokeby Line Bear Creek construction. The engineering firm had prepared a quantities list that had been provided to the contractor.

Councillor McCallum discussed the circulation of material for the Senior Advisory Committee.
