JULY 17 2023

A meeting of the Council of the Township of Enniskillen was held on Monday July 17 2023 at 7:00 pm at the Enniskillen Council Chambers.

Present: Wally Van Dun, Mary Lynne McCallum and Judy Krall

Deputy Mayor Krall chaired the meeting.

Pecuniary Interest

Deputy Mayor Krall requested that each member of Council declare an interest at the appropriate time within the agenda where an interest may exist.

A. Minutes

Moved by Councillor McCallum Seconded by Councilor Van Dun That the minutes of the meeting of July 4 2023 be adopted as circulated. Carried.

B. Meeting to Consider: McMurphy Drain Report 7:00 pm

Moved by Councillor Van Dun Seconded by Councillor McCallum That the meeting to consider the McMurphy Drain Report be opened. Carried.

Present: Ray Dobbin

No ratepayers were present for the drain.

Ray Dobbin reviewed the drainage report. He discussed the cleanout of the drain had exposed the poor quality of the culverts on the drain. The report provided for the design standards for the replacement of most of the culverts on the drain. Mr. Dobbin noted that the owners of culvert # 1 were not interested in replacing the culvert at the current time.

Mr. Dobbin noted that he had spoken with Collin Dobbin who had agreed for the need to replace his culvert on the drain.

The Clerk noted that the engineer and Road Superintendent would inspect the road culverts prior to the tendering of the project.

That the McMurphy Drain report be adopted. Carried.

The Clerk noted that the placement of dust suppressant on gravel roads had been completed.

Parks: Marthaville Park- pavilion repairs

The Clerk requested Council approval for the repairs to the Marthaville Park pavilion supports. The Clerk noted that the work would consist of replacing portions of the rotted support posts with precast concrete posts.

That a contractor be hired to make repairs to the Marthaville park pavilion support posts for an estimated cost of \$7,000.00 Carried.

The Clerk noted that funds from the Marthaville Park Trillium Foundation project would be used to pay for the work.

C. Meeting to consider: Perkins Drain Report and German Drain East and West Reports

Moved by Councillor Van Dun Seconded by Councillor McCallum

That the meeting to consider the Perkins Drain Report and the German Drain East and West be opened.

Carried.

Present: Larry Annett, Wayne Gilroy, Paul Huzinga, Janet and Ken Dunlop. Joel Fields was present representing the Town of Petrolia. Ray Dobbin and David Moores- R Dobbin Engineering

Ray Dobbin presented the report on the Perkins Drain. He reported that two road culverts and one private culvert were to be replaced in the report.

He reviewed the schedule of assessment and the maintenance provisions in the report.

The report also contained maintenance schedules for sections of the Perkins Drain.

Wayne Gilroy was provided an explanation of the work to be undertaken on the Drainn. He reported that 20 acres of his farm was assessed into the McNabb Drain.

Ray Dobbin noted that he would speak to Mr. Gilroy after reviewing the McNabb Drain Report.

Mr. Gilroy discussed the levelling of dirt from the clean out of the Perkins Drain.

Moved by Councillor Van Dun Seconded by Councillor McCallum That the Perkins Drain report be adopted. Carried. Ray Dobbin presented the report on the German Drain East and West.

The report provided for the clean out of the drain and provided provisions for culvert replacement on the drain. He noted that two existing access culverts were brought under the provisions of the report.

Mr. Dobbin noted that the report provided for accesses to properties in the drain. Additional culvert lengths would be the responsibility of the property owners. The report provided estimated costs and schedules of assessment.

Wayne Gilroy noted that 20 acres of his farm were assessed into the McNabb Drain.

Ken Dunlop questioned whether the culverts in the drain would be cleaned. Paul Huzinga and Larry Annett expressed no concerns about the report.

Ken Dunlop noted that he wanted the dirt hauled from his property.

Moved by Councillor McCallum Seconded by Councillor Van Dun That the German Drain East and West Report be adopted. Carried.

The Clerk noted that notices for Court of Revision would be circulated once a review had been completed on the drainage area for the drains. Revised schedules of assessment may be included within the notice for the Court of Revision.
